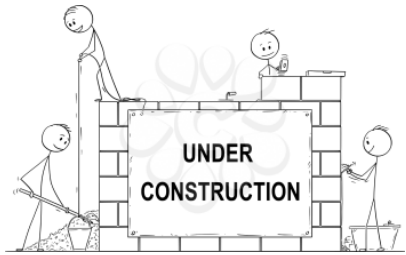

EXCITING NEWS FROM SCHOOL
STEAM

(Science Technology Engineering Art and Math)

Trinity is starting this year with a different curriculum in my classroom. Grades 1 - 5 students have started with Chain Reaction using dominoes. With this course, the students will be issued a unique challenge in the middle of September. I'll ask the families to donate boxes of food. The kids will use these items to build a chain reaction machine in Fellowship Hall. All food items will be donated to a local pantry after the class is completed.

Future City Competition (National Engineering)

The Middle School has been registered for a National Engineering competition called Future City. During the first semester, the students will be writing an Essay on "Fire Resiliency". Then, designing a Future City using some of their essay research. These designs will be turned into a 3D model using recyclable items. Future city teams will create a 7-minute presentation. The final product will be presented at the Regional Competition in Denver.

Volunteers will be welcomed when we start building the models. Help is needed supervising the builds. Also, quizzing the students on their cities. I'll give more information as we get closer to this phase.

I know it looks daunting but with many working together it is "do-able".

Evangelism...

"No, evangelism is speaking words. It's sharing news. It's being faithful to God by presenting the good news—that Christ, by His death and resurrection, has secured a way for a holy God and sinful people to be reconciled. God will produce true conversions when we present this good news (see John 1:13; Acts 18:9–10).

In short, evangelism is presenting the good news freely and trusting God to convert people (see Acts 16:14). "Salvation comes from the Lord" (Jonah 2:9; cf. John 1:12–13)." BY PR.MARK DEVER.

Evangelism...is a scary word and strikes fear into our hearts! "I am not good enough (Moses), I can't speak to strangers, I might make a mistake or say the wrong thing."

Evangelism is a conversation of meeting people where they are in their life. It is not only talking BUT listening too! It is treating people the way you want to be treated. I sure hope you would want to be told about the love of Jesus. It is letting the Holy Spirit do His part; you are not alone in this.

Many are the days that I pray to God to put the right words into my mouth and let them flow out like honey...something to be desired by the listener. And then I think what could be so wrong about the love of Jesus? I should not only want to do this but NEED to do this.

It is baby steps: talk, relate-build a relationship by listening and relating to the other person's joy and pains; build trust.

Some people will be receptive and others will not. It is through no fault of your own if the person is not receptive. Just remember that we are called to "plant the seed" and someone else will tend and water the seed and still someone else will do the harvesting.

"It is better to have tried and failed, than to not try and (still) fail, "Practice makes perfect." OR "If you don't succeed, you should try try again. "I thank God for the opportunities that He presents to me. I like some of them, I love some of them, some of them I succeed at, and then there are those that I loathe and try to find a way out. (Haha)
