New Beginnings

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! –

2 Corinthians 5:17

Do you ever think about why we celebrate New Year's Day? It's really just another day, so why is it so important for people to mark a date change on a calendar?

January, to some of us, is the most important month of the year. It seems like a natural time for beginning something, which is why lots of people make New Year's resolutions.

The Christian life offers lots of opportunities for fresh starts, for changing what we've been doing or beginning to live differently. Each week in worship, we begin with a time of confession where we admit what we've done wrong. We admit to God and to each other that our lives are not perfect, that we're not living the way we ought to live, that we're doing things we ought not do and failing to do things we ought to do.

Then, immediately after confession, in our Divine Service, we hear God's response. We hear the good news that because of God's forgiveness, because God loves us, we all get a fresh start. Psalm 103:12 says God has taken our sins away from us "*as far as the east is from the west.*" The slate is wiped clean. We don't need to carry the weight of our sins or guilt with us anymore. We are forgiven! We remember God's love and that God never gets tired of forgiving us!

In *The Small Catechism*, Martin Luther said we ought to begin each day in this way:

"In the morning, as soon as you get out of bed, you are to make the sign of the holy cross and say: 'God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit watch over me. Amen.' Then, kneeling or standing, say the Apostle's Creed and the Lord's Prayer...After singing a hymn, or whatever else may serve your devotion, you are to go to your work joyfully."

CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS

CHURCH VOTERS MINUTES – DECEMBER 14, 2025

President Tom Gaide called the meeting to order and Pastor Hauer opened with prayer.

22 members were present. Minutes from the July and October voters' meetings were approved. Kaven Martinez was accepted as a new voting member.

Pastor Hauer – Pastor informed the members that Pastor Nick Shults has accepted a call to St. Louis. His last day at Our Savior's / Bethany is January 4, 2026. He is working on an evangelism program. He shared with us that St Peter's in Monte Vista is currently served by a vicar and will be their pastor when he is ordained.

Lucky Schneberger, Call Committee – Doug Massengill has moved to Colorado Springs. Lucky is the new chairman of the committee. There are seven members on the committee: Kacia Vigil, Matt Lawrenz, Evelyn Daberkow, Dennis Scofield, Jon Bush, Lorna Romero, and Lucky Schneberger. We are asking the District to get the necessary paperwork to continue the search for a pastor. The Call Committee serves under the Board of Elders.

Scott Harberts, Board of Elders – The elders continue to support Pastor and assign readers and elders to serve at each service. They will be meeting on Monday, December 22 to assemble goody bags.

Derion Ibarra, Principal, Board of Education – We have two Christmas programs – one on Monday, Dec. 15, for the ELA through first grade. On Tuesday, Dec. 16, the program is for second through sixth grade. Both programs are at 5:30 p.m. Christmas vacation is from December 19 – January 2.

Derion invited members of the congregation to be more involved with the school, asking them to volunteer, from reading to students to helping with lunch or classroom activities. We now have 71 students.

Janelle Sheppard for JoAnn Jaramillo, Board of Childhood Education – One of the toddlers is moving into the Preschool classroom. All teachers are doing well. They are looking at discounts and focusing on an accurate budget.

Tom Gaide stated the ELA is looking for someone to volunteer one or two times a week to give JoAnn time for her administrative duties.

Board of Trustees – Tom reported that John Aggson worked with Derion Ibarra to repair the heating unit on the roof. John hasn't found an assessor for the facility and has not been able to take photos of the roof. He will be making repairs to the boy's bathroom over Christmas vacation.

We still owe around \$37,000 on the roof. The roofer has been paid from the loan we have with Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) so we still need to repay the loan.

Evangelism – A special thank you to Becky Hauer for decorating the fellowship hall. Kris Bruun will continue to chair the St. Fair booth again.

Finance / Budget – The monthly statement of financial position is attached to these minutes. Our net income is -\$44,500. Our next payment from BOCES will come in January which will help balance the books. Tom Gaide suggested that increased giving would be wonderful.

Elections – Individuals will continue to serve in their current positions. The following people were elected to serve:

Kaven Martinez – Facility Manager

Bill Giebel – Board of Trustees

Kris Bruun – Board of Evangelism

Kaven Martinez – chairman of Board of Evangelism

Old Business – None

New Business – Lucky Schneberger shared with the members obstacles that exist in calling a pastor. The pool of candidates for a pastor is small. Small congregations may need to merge. Direction as we move forward in the call process will come from the District office and our circuit counselor.

Pastor Bob indicated that four services on a weekend -- a Saturday night service at Trinity plus Sunday morning services at Bethany, Our Savior's, and Trinity -- would be a lot for one person. It might be possible to get a vicar to support a pastor.

A vicar is a "pastor in training" and an individual who has completed two years at the seminary, then serves a congregation, finally returning to the seminary before being ordained. Both Ft. Wayne and St. Louis seminaries have small class sizes.

We anticipate holding another voters meeting in late February or early March to call another pastor.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with prayer.
