“THE HAND OF THE LORD”

Dear Friends in Christ,

Whether tightening a bolt, crocheting, or typing on a computer, there is so much that we do with our hands. The Greek physician Galen called them *the instrument of instruments*. Indeed, hands are instruments that can do a great deal of things. Hands can be used to heal or hurt, work or wreck, build or break, seize or surrender, and on and on. Hands are so often central to the ways we interact with the world that they have also become figurative symbols of power, control, craftsmanship, and possession. We daily speak of hands in many phrases, such as “Lend a hand,” “Things are out of hand,” “Working together hand in glove,” and “Close at hand.” Moreover, in our modern era of robotic, machine, and computer processing, adding “hand” as a prefix to many words can often communicate something that is personal and intentional. Labeling something as handpicked, handwritten, or handmade adds a personal touch and significance. Our Creator has bestowed on us these amazing instruments.

It is no surprise that mentions of hands appear all over the Bible as God’s Word speaks to us in ways that we can understand. All things are the work of the hand of the Lord (Psalm 102:25). The Lord’s hand is referred to over two hundred times in the Old Testament. The Lord’s hand is active in creation, power, control over happenings of the world, judgment, and salvation. The hand of the Lord was upon Ezekiel when He gave him a vision (Ezekiel 3:22), and the hand of the Lord

was against the Philistines in the days of Samuel (1 Samuel 7:13). The hand of the Lord is both Law and Gospel.

Perhaps surprisingly, specific references to the “hand of the Lord” are not all that frequent in the New Testament. However, it is precisely in the New Testament where the hand of the Lord takes on literal meaning. The One through whom all things were created took on real, literal hands in His incarnation (John 1:1–14). We have several examples throughout Scripture that speak of the way that Christ used His hands alongside His life-giving words to bring forgiveness, life, and salvation. The work of Christ’s hands helps us to see the merciful and personal way that He has condescended to us. He has given us something to grasp, even as He holds us. Jesus used His hands to save drowning Peter, to feed the multitudes, to touch those who were unclean, to stop a funeral procession in its tracks, to lift up Jairus’s daughter, and to bless the children. The hand of the Lord has come to us in Jesus.

On the other hand, the literal and figurative actions of mere human hands in the Bible are often the means of our own sin. After all, our own Lord was “delivered into the hands of men” (Luke 9:44). However, on a greater level, we know that it was the hand of the Lord at work all along, most especially in His crucifixion. Christ laid down His life of His own authority as He allowed Himself to be delivered into the hands of sinful men (John 10:18). His hands were pierced

for the sins of the world. His hands rested on Holy Saturday. Yet, on the third day, He rose again. He now holds us in His hands, and no one can snatch us from His hand (John 10:28). Our Lord has hands, real hands. Jesus has accomplished all that we need. Amazingly, He takes our manipulative, distorted, self-serving hands and restores them into useful hands for His purposes, both to literally use them in service and to make our whole lives into His instruments of witness, service, and praise.

Come and worship this Lenten Season, starting on Ash Wednesday and every Wednesday until Holy Week, and hear about *The Hand of the Lord* for you.

The week included various activities to celebrate the vastness of God's love. Each day celebrated Mongolia.

MONDAY students dressed as a favorite Mongolian animal.

TUESDAY students went to the zoo where a Zookeeper talked about the various animals in Mongolia.

WEDNESDAY the students dressed in the colors of the Mongolian flag: red, yellow, or blue. Watched a video in Chapel where the children learned about how to prepare a feast to share with friend and neighbors and saw how a yurt was constructed. Ask them about the way sheep was cooked.

CHURCH UP DATE

CHURCH COUNCIL JANUARY 15, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Scott Harberts and Pastor Hauer led a devotion from Psalms. Members in attendance were JoAnn Jaramillo, Pastor Hauer, Derion Ibarra, Janelle Sheppard, Kaven Martinez, John Agson, Scott Harberts, and Jo Ann Russ. Minutes from the November meeting were approved.

JoAnn Jaramillo, Director, Early Learning Academy, Board of Early Childhood Education – They are back to normal staffing. They had a licensing visit and had a few minor citations. Some of JoAnn's qualification documentation was missing a proper signature. She has corrected that issue. They need to have emergency drills and are in the process of getting a nurse consultant. There are three tours scheduled for next week for fall classes and the toddler room. They already have seven children signed up for next fall's Universal Pre-K and expect to be at full capacity.

Pastor Hauer – Pastor Jason Cody from Trinity in Alamosa, is our new circuit counselor. The ordination of Pastor Joshua Cody will take place on Saturday, January 17 in Monte Vista. (Jason and Joshua are brothers.) Pastor Bob will be gone the next two weekends for the ordination and a ministry conference in California. Pastor Dan Kletke is on extended leave and Pastor Lyle Stuehrenberg, is serving St. John's in Canon City as well as Our Savior's and Bethany. We will share Lenten services with Our Savior's and Bethany and will have two Wednesday night services here.

Derion Ibarra, Principal, Board of Education – The dedication of the Dr. Matt Philson Buddy Bench was held on January 9. The bench was donated to Trinity School by A Slice of Life, a joint project between Dave Feamster and Tim Brotherton. The Buddy Bench will be on the playground and is designed to help a child find some company or someone to play with.

National Schools Week is coming up, with the Fun Run set for January 26. They are

planning for next year and are considering a continuous learning school calendar. A small increase in tuition is expected. The school continues to expand and will be adding 7th grade in the fall. Derion is working with John Aggson to improve the heating in the school entrance. Because of the high ceiling, the entrance remains cold but the heat ends up making the classroom hallway very warm.

John Aggson, Board of Trustees –

They were able to repair a heating unit, with the price of parts at \$1700. John has also replaced the filters in the gym. Derion Ibarra thanked John for replacing the toilet in the boy's bathroom. John has been unable to get an appraiser for our facility as the fee would be \$3000 - \$4000. After reviewing our insurance coverage, the board motioned we become self-insured, and keep only liability insurance coverage. Evelyn Daberkow seconded the motion. Kaven Martinez indicated we could do a lot to improve security by adding cameras and motion sensors, at a much cheaper price than the cost of full coverage insurance. This will be presented at the next voters meeting.

Scott Harberts, Board of Elders – Ash

Wednesday is February 18. Lenten services will be shared with Bethany and Our Savior's. Attendance on Christmas Eve was 118. Lucky Schneberger is starting an adult education class for two possible members. We will advertise this class for any others who are interested. Scott and Tom Gaide will be meeting with elders from Bethany and Our Savior's to discuss the needs of our three churches in Pueblo. The elders are working on nominations for synod officers, which are due by February 18. They will bring these nominations to the voters meeting that is scheduled for February 8.

Call Committee – Tom Gaide informed

the council that the call committee has sent new paperwork to District, including one new name to be added to the call list. They are waiting for the District to return the documents so the committee can proceed with calling another pastor.

Treasurer's Report – The statement of

financial position is attached to these minutes.

Kaven Martinez, Board of Evangelism – is

planning a fundraiser for Pastor Kletke, to be held on February 1, which will include Our Savior's and Bethany. There is a baby shower scheduled for

February 17 and an anniversary party set for February 28.

There being no additional old or new business, the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
